- We need more funds to do more good things.
- Central & Local Government funding is currently in decline.
- Increasing competition for limited grant aid sources.
- New funding arrangements mean new partners, (and that could be an opportunity).


Declining Government Funding -

National Parks -

- England £44.7m in 2016/16, compared with £56m in 2010/11 - cuts of c. 40% led to 225 job losses and cuts in activities.
- Wales Similar 40% cuts over previous decade now further fears raised in 2016 over further 5% cuts.
- Scotland reductions of c. 5-9% between 2010/11 and 2013/14?

Declining Government Funding

AONBs -

- A very different funding model → challenges for longer.
- AONB partnerships in England receive c. £6m of `Defra pot` for protected areas (c. £50m) - across 34 AONB partnerships.
- Different funding models in Wales, Scotland, and Northern Ireland

Diversifying AONB funding: Background drivers -

- Reduced funding Defra and Local Authorities
- Paradigm shift from public to private delivery
- Regulation and incentives out of favour
- Markets for ecosystem services preferred
- Adapt or die?? / Revolution or evolution??



AONB Funding Sources

Figures for 2015 suggest total turnover of English AONB partnerships was c. £18m

- Defra funding to AONBs in England c. £6m.
- Local Authorities' core grant c. £2m
- Second largest source of funding National Lottery c. £2.8m
- AONBs raising almost 50% funds from other sources.


