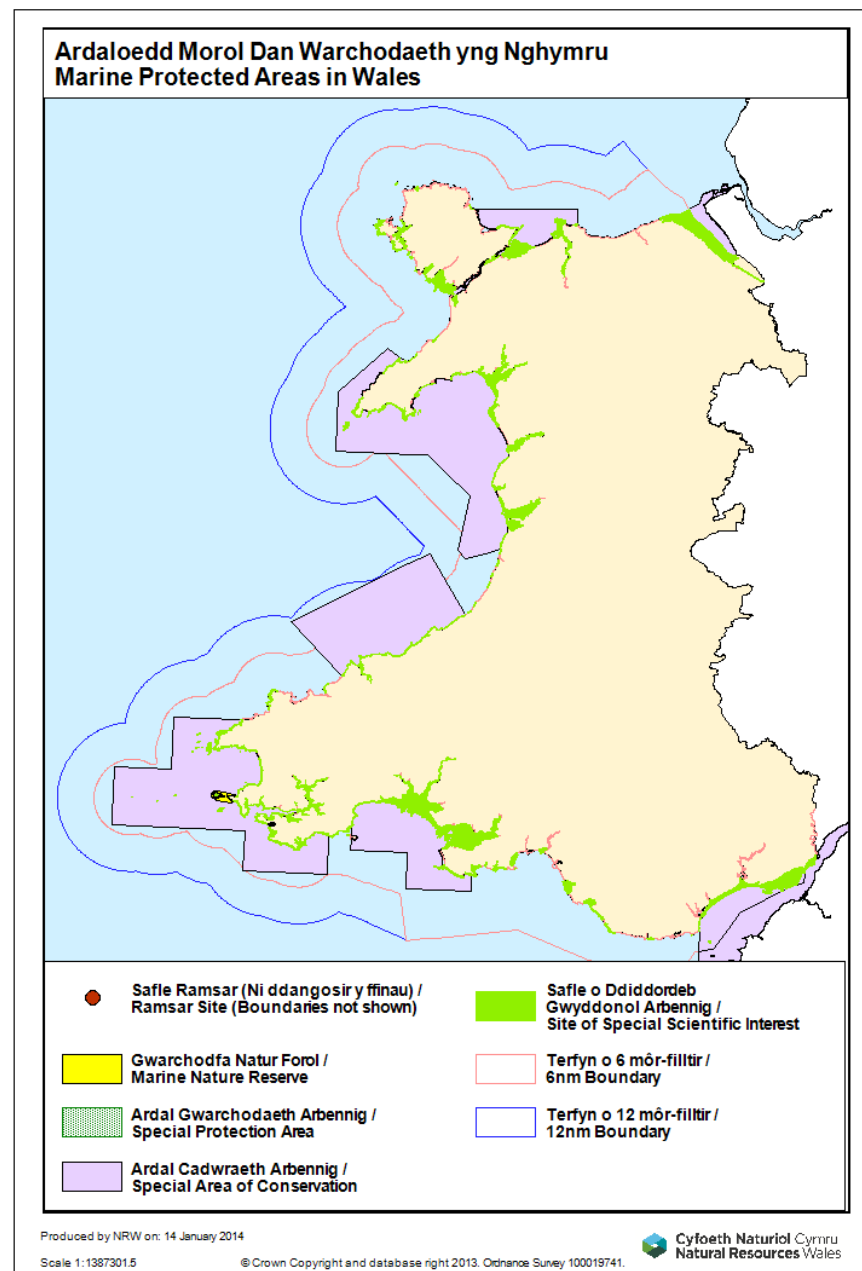

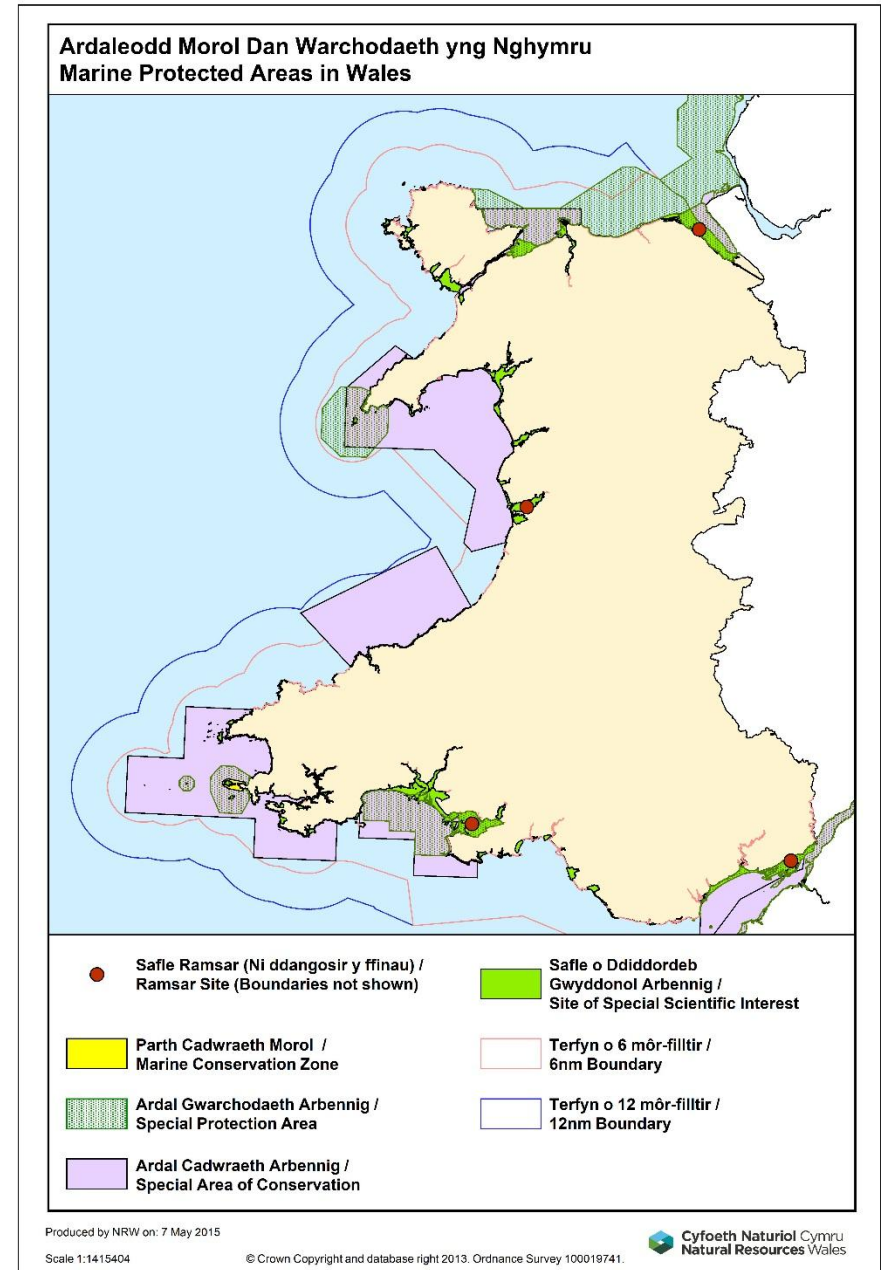

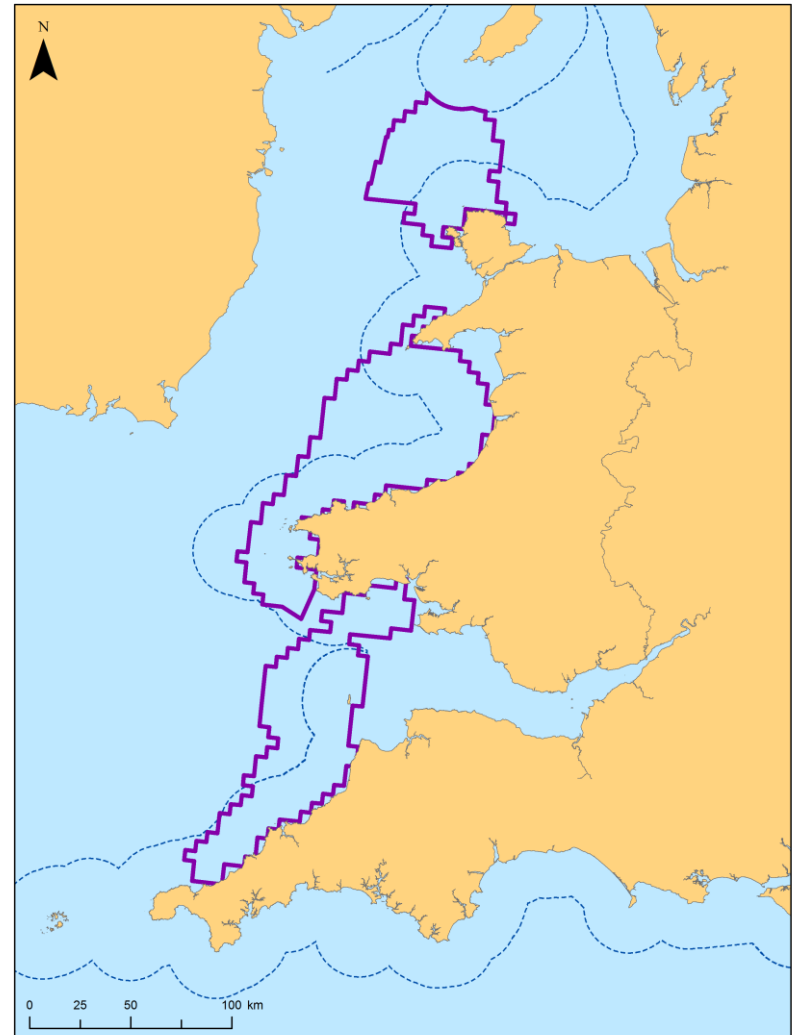

- % coverage of MPAs in Welsh waters - 35%





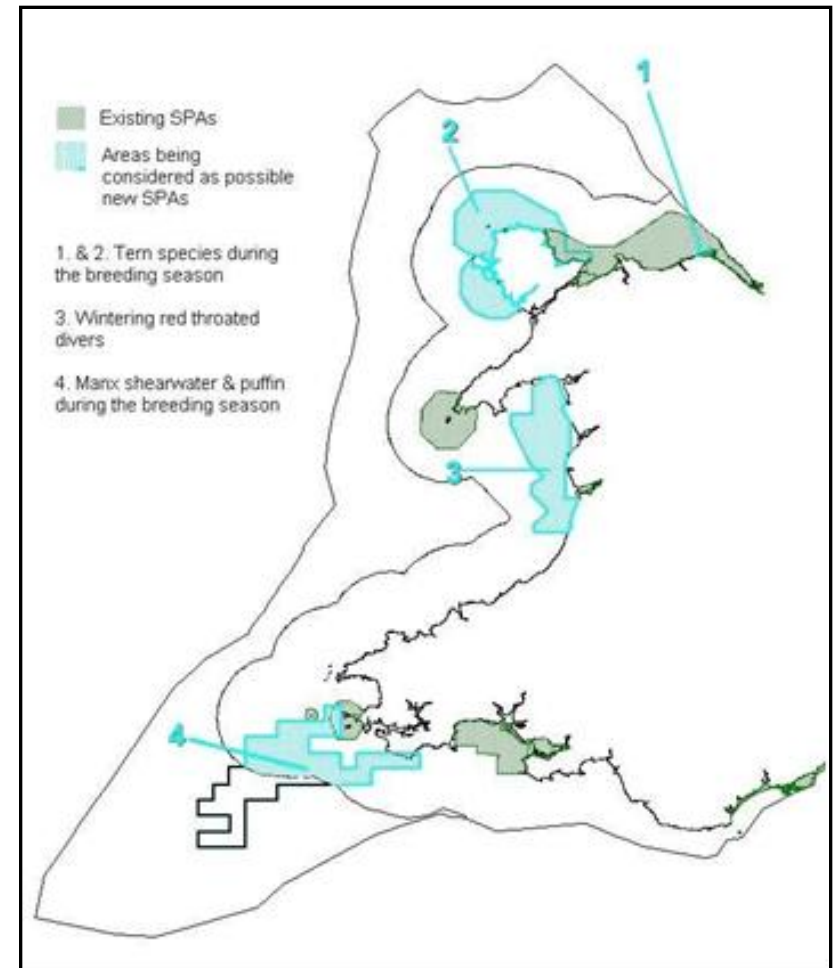
Possible new SACs in Wales

- Informal discussions are currently being held with stakeholders on possible new SACs for harbour porpoise in Welsh waters.
- Site selection was underpinned by the Joint Cetacean Protocol (JCP) a collation of standardised survey data which included:
 - Boat based & aerial surveys
 - 545 surveys
 - 18 years of data



Possible new SPAs in Wales

- We are also in informal discussions with stakeholders about a range of possible new SPAs in Wales.
- Sites for Terns, Red-throated divers and Manx Shearwater and Puffin.
- Formal consultation currently planned for late July.





MPA management review.

The MPA Management review was published in 2012 with two main reports produced:

1. Overview of current MPA management in Wales and a summary of new MPA management tools.
2. Evaluation of current MPA management in Wales.





Main outcomes from the MPA management review.

There is a need for:

- **Consistency** in MPA management regimes.
- **Additional support and direction** from the Welsh Government.
- **Raising the priority of MPA management** in some management authorities.





Shared principles for MPA management

Improving the effectiveness of MPA management and site condition requires:

- 1. Leadership**
- 2. Co-ordination and Consistency.**
- 3. Prioritisation**
- 4. Collaboration**
- 5. Communication**





Embedding these shared principles

Create a Welsh MPA Network Management Steering Group to provide strategic co-ordination of MPA management in Welsh seas.

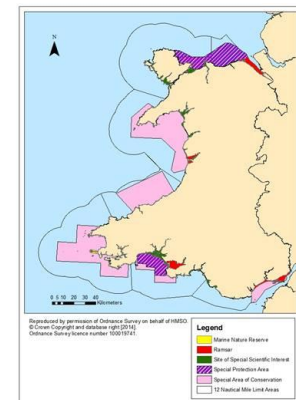
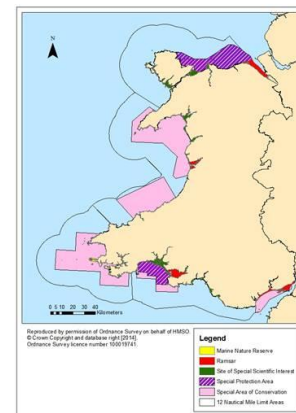
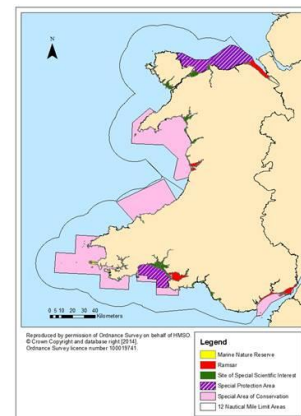
- Sustainable management for the MPA network.

Report B: New Spatial Options

A spatial based approach to managing the network has been proposed to stakeholders – four options were considered:

- Continue with the current system
- A regional approach – two areas north and south
- An area approach – four management areas
- A local approach – seven management areas



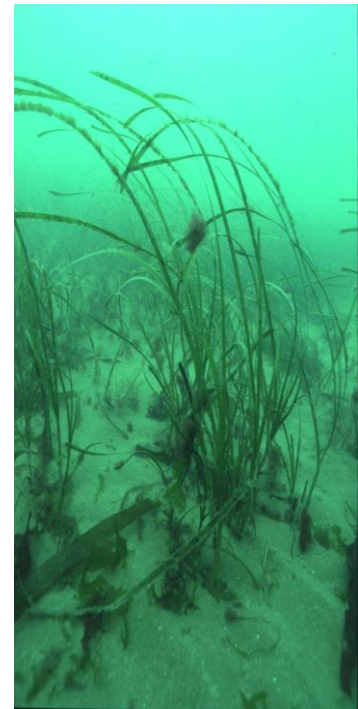


Consulting with Stakeholders

- WMSAG – Welsh Marine Stakeholder Advisory Group

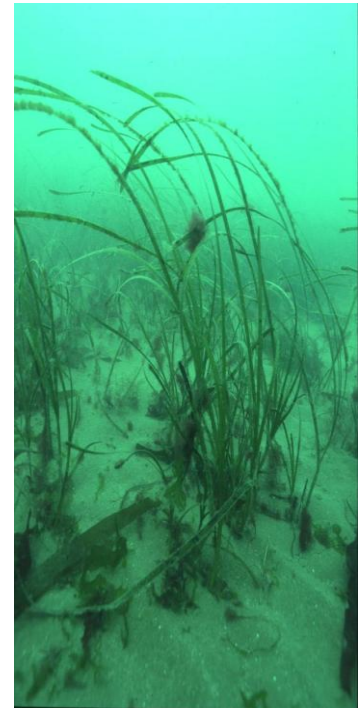
Information provided:

- Potential Boundaries
- Management structures
- Percentages of MPA within each area
- Estimated facilitation costs
- Assessment against the network objectives



Next Steps

- Informal consultation on management areas has closed
- Summary report is being prepared for the next MPA Network Management Steering Group on the 09th of June
- Need to consider sustainable funding sources
- Further consideration needs to be given to boundaries and we are likely to consult with stakeholders again
